Edmund Dawe

“sensitive, engaging, and virtuoso” *La Scena Musicale*

Edmund Dawe’s career includes a wide range of activities as a solo and collaborative pianist, administrator, teacher, adjudicator, and lecturer/clinician. He has held academic and administrative appointments at several Canadian universities. His academic career includes 17 years at Mount Allison University in and, from 2007-2018, he served as Dean of the Desautels Faculty of Music at the University of Manitoba.

Praised for his technical command of the piano and artistic interpretations, Edmund has performed as a soloist and collaborative pianist in Canada, the United States, Europe and Asia.

Edmund has received numerous awards and distinctions in his career including teaching and research awards as well as grants from the Canada Council, the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade, and Provincial Arts Councils. Edmund has been twice nominated for an East Coast Music Award (Best Classical) for his solo recording, *Sonatas*, and piano duo recording, *Dialogue*, with colleague Lynn Johnson.

From 2007-2018, Edmund led the Desautels Faculty of Music through a period of growth, including construction of the most modern university music facilities in Canada that combine the restoration of a historic building with new state-of-the-art rehearsal, recording, and multimedia spaces. Edmund recently retired from the University of Manitoba, and was appointed Dean Emeritus.



Kyra Millan

Soprano/Artist Educator

Opera comedienne Kyra Millan is happiest teaching singing and creating quirky shows that allow her to blend education and performance, as her unique career has been a balance of both. Kyra embarked last year on her first Ontario tour of her original show *"Millan & Faye Present: The Opera!"* to theatres including The Four Seasons Centre, Richmond Hill Performing Arts Centre, Elora Music Festival, Welland Port Colbourne Concert Association, and Ottawa's International Chamber Music Festival, with her music duo partner Christina Faye.

Kyra's work in arts education began 18 years ago, facilitating opera workshops for the Canadian Opera Company, as well as being musical director of their Summer Youth Intensive training program, and many summer camps. She is a leading artist-educator in opera in schools and has facilitated many workshops for the Royal Conservatory of Music, Opera Atelier, and the Canadian Opera Company, Workman Arts (CAMH), Abilities Arts, Soundstreams Canada and TIFF. She coaches aspiring singers and professionals in her private studio in Toronto, and has been an adjudicator for both Provincial and local Kiwanis Music Festivals. As a voice coach for actors, Kyra has worked on professional productions in Canada for companies such as Canadian Stage, Stage West, Young People's Theatre and the National Arts Centre, as well as for international touring productions. Most recently, she coached Warner Brothers' international touring productions of *Scooby Doo Live Onstage* and Mills Entertainment's *Spank! The Fifty Shades Parody*. Kyra also directs *Gleesical*, a create-your-own-musical program for kids in Toronto's west end.



Greg Burton

Greg Burton continues to manage a varied career in music that includes conducting, performing and teaching. He is currently on the faculty of Mount Allison University, teaching courses in the music department and conducting the Mount Allison University Orchestra. Greg performs regularly as a trombonist with Symphony New Brunswick. He has been privileged to have been Music Director of the York Symphony Orchestra, The Halton-Mississauga Youth Orchestra, as well as the Nova Scotia Youth Orchestra. Greg enjoys working with university-aged musicians and has held positions at a number of universities including The University of Toronto, McMaster University and Arizona State University. Greg has been a trombonist and Resident Conductor with Symphony Nova Scotia, and he continues to guest conduct that ensemble each season.
